1. Saul the _____

“They took him out of the city and began to throw stones at him to kill him. And those who told lies against Stephen left their coats with a young man named Saul.”

Acts 7:58 (New Century Version)

“As he was approaching Damascus on this mission, a light from heaven suddenly shone down around him. He fell to the ground and heard a voice saying to him, “Saul! Saul!

Why are you persecuting me?”

“Who are you, Lord?” Saul asked. And the voice replied, “I am Jesus, the one you are persecuting! Now get up and go into the city, and you will be told what you must do.”

3. Saul’s _____

“Now there was a believer in Damascus named Ananias. The Lord spoke to him in a vision, calling, “Ananias!” “Yes, Lord!” he replied. The Lord said, “Go over to Straight Street, to the house of Judas. When you get there, ask for a man from Tarsus named Saul. He is praying to me right now. I have shown him a vision of a man named Ananias coming in and laying hands on him so he can see again.

Then Barnabas brought him to the apostles and told them how Saul had seen the Lord...and how the Lord had spoken to Saul...So Saul stayed with the apostles...”

“But the word of God continued to increase and spread. When Barnabas and Saul had finished their mission, they returned from Jerusalem...In the church at Antioch there were prophets and teachers: Barnabas...and Saul. While they were worshiping the Lord and fasting, the Holy Spirit said, “Set apart for me Barnabas and Saul for the work to which I have called them.” So after they had fasted and prayed, they placed their hands on them and sent them off.” Acts 12:24-13:4 (New King James Version)
